

It has been reported that the new waste--water treatment system is in place and operating in the area of the old "snake pit."

The newly constructed Building 7631, replacing the old Building 7631, has now been occupied. This building, which Thiokol never occupied after its construction by Lee Builders (Jack Lee and sons), has been furnished and occupied by MICOM people. It is furnished about like we had planned to furnish it.

Except for these two areas, the plant seems deserted. There are no guards and no flowers, just the appearance of a ghost town.

Directions to HDAA Picnic

Redstone Road is no longer a straight shot from the Parkway into the Arsenal. And, Gate Three is no longer open around the clock or on weekends.

The best way to get to the picnic area is to come onto the arsenal at the Martin Road, Rideout Road, or Drake Avenue gates. These gates are usually manned now, but the guards are usually very helpful. All you need to do to get a temporary car pass is show the guard your driver's license and tell him where you are going (the Carroll Hudson Recreation Area).
