

The general membership will vote on the above-nominated slate on Thursday, December 2, 2004, as presented by HDAA's current President, Ron Clements. Write-in candidates will be considered at the meeting 12/2. The below-noted proposed changes to the HDAA Bylaws will also be voted upon, so please review them.

### Proposed Changes to HDAA Bylaws

Wording of the current bylaws pertaining to the reelection of officers has caused some confusion. wording has been interpreted to mean that once a person served in an office, he/she could never repeat in that office in the future. It is proposed that the wording be changed slightly to clarify the situation for future nominations.

The proposed change was approved by the Board of Directors at the quarterly meeting on October 14, 2004, and is noted below for general membership review. The proposed changes will be voted upon at the December 2 general membership dinner meeting.

The current wording of the Officers section of the Bylaws is as follows:

The Association shall have officers common to such organizations. These shall include a presiding officer known as the President, a designated successor known as the Vice President, an officer known as Secretary to maintain records, and an officer known as Treasurer to hold financial resources and maintain

suitable financial records. At the time of their election, officers shall be residents of Madison County, Alabama, or of an adjoining county in Alabama or Tennessee.

Terms of officer shall be one year, or less if elected after the beginning of a calendar year. An officer shall not be reelected to an office after completing a full term. An officer may be removed from office "for cause" by a two-thirds vote of the Board of Directors.

The first paragraph shall remain the same, and the second paragraph shall have the proposed wording as follows:

Terms of office shall be one year, or less if elected after the beginning of a calendar year. An officer shall not be reelected to the same office for at least one year after completing a full term in that office. An officer may be removed from office "for cause" by a two-thirds vote of the Board of Directors.

This minor change will be voted on at the 12/2 meeting.
