Orbital ATK Products Support Search for New Sources of Minerals/Fuels

November 11, 2016, Orbital ATK provided critical launch vehicle and payload hardware for the Lockheed Martin Commercial Launch Services launch of DigitalGlobe's WorldView-4 satellite aboard an Atlas V from Vandenberg AFB, California.

Operating at an expected altitude of 617 km in coordination with the DigitalGlobe WorldView-3 satellite, WorldView-4 is a multi-spectral, high resolution commercial satellite for Earth observations and advanced geospatial solutions. Its data-rich imagery will enable customers to search for new sources of minerals and fuels, manage forests and farms and accelerate DigitalGlobe's living digital inventory of the surface of the earth.

Orbital ATK's contributions to the Atlas V and WorldView satellite include a large composite heat shield, which provides higher performance with lower weight and protection for the first stage of the launch vehicle from engine exhaust temperatures >4,000°F. Eight solid retro motors supported separation of the spent first stage.
