JOIN US AT BROOKDALE FOR OUR FALL EVENT!!



Orbital ATK Successfully Completes Launch of Intermediate Range Ballistic Missile Target

A critical element of U.S. missile shield testing, the successful IRBM target test validates the Terminal High Altitude Area Defense (THAAD) flight test program for the Missile Defense Agency (MDA).

The IRBM target was air-dropped from the cargo hold of a C-17 aircraft and lowered by parachutes before igniting and performing its mission of simulating an IRBM threat.

The IRBM target uses Orbital ATK's Orion family of solid rocket motors, originally designed for the air-launched Pegasus space launch vehicle. The Orbital ATK facilities in Huntsville, AL; Chandler, AZ; Magna and Clearfield, UT contributed to this successful test.




